Special issue on "The coordinated international field campaign on the Madden-Julian Oscillation"

<< Description >>

From October 2011 through March 2012, a coordinated international field campaign was carried out to collect observations in and around the tropical Indian Ocean. The aim of this campaign was to advance our knowledge of the Madden-Julian Oscillation (MJO) with special focus on the convective initiation, and to improve the skill of the MJO simulation and prediction. This campaign actually consisted of several projects including CINDY2011 (Cooperative Indian Ocean experiment on intraseasonal variability in the Year 2011), DYNAMO (Dynamics of the MJO), AMIE (Atmospheric Radiation Measurement program – MJO Investigation Experiment), and LASP (Littoral Air-sea Process), as well as other various relevant activities. Quality-controlled data have been released to the public from CINDY and DYNAMO data archive centers since April 2013, in addition to immediate data release from ARM. Thus, now anyone can use those data. This special issue solicits to submit a paper that is produced using those data as well as numerical and theoretical studies related to this field campaign.
